Academic Program:

Due to our challenging academic standards, Trafalgar Castle School does not rank students and calculates GPA of the current year. Grade 11 and 12 courses are taught at the most advanced level (University Preparation or University/College Preparation). Interim, anticipated or predicted grades are based on evidence demonstrated in the classroom.

Academic Program (cont'd):

Students are graded on a 100-point scale. Advanced Placement (AP) courses are aligned with the Ontario Grade 11 and 12 3U/M and 4U/M credits.

Trafalgar's AP program offers an extension opportunity for those students desiring academic enrichment in addition to completing the rigorous requirements for the Ontario Secondary School Diploma. The School's AP Policy states:

- Grade 11 students can take one AP course; and
- Grade 12 students can take up to three AP courses.

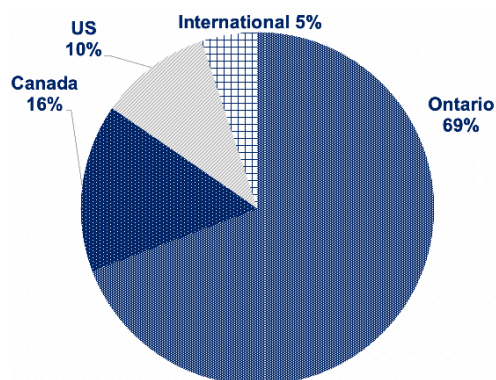
AP Courses are available in:

- Statistics.

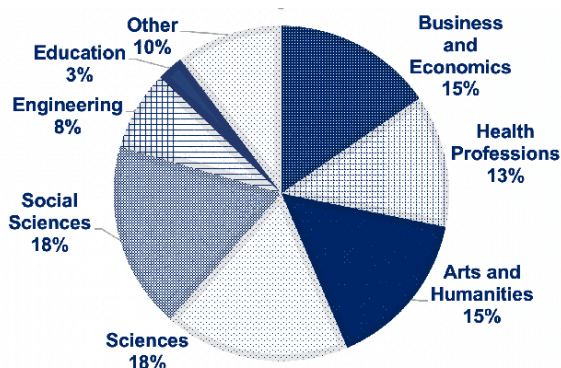
Our Graduates:
